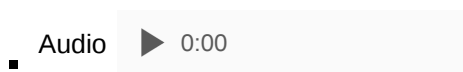

Noun

أَهْلٌ (ʾahl) *m. sg. m. pl. (plural أَهَالٍ (ʾahālin) or أَهْلُونَا (ʾahlūna), plural construct state أَهَالِي (ʾahālī))*

1. family, kinfolk
2. people, membership (body of members), followership (group of followers) (+ **genitive**, of)

Verb

2. (*transitive*) to become accustomed to (a place)

2. fit, suited, qualified, eligible, competent
