Hukam (<u>Punjabi</u>: ਹੁਕਮਿ) is a <u>Punjabi</u> word derived from the <u>Arabic hukm</u>, meaning "command" or "divine order."^[1] In Sikhism, Hukam represents the goal of becoming in harmony with the will of God and thus attaining inner peace. It also designates the practice of opening up at random to a page in the Sikh scripture (Guru Granth Sahib) to receive God's guidance on how to handle a certain situation, as answer to a question, or as more general guidance for that day
