# **Etymology**

Uncertain. Possibly from the trilateral root  $\underline{\psi}$  (b-l-s) with the general meaning of "despair",  $\overline{\hat{\mu}}$  (balasa). Alternatively theorized to come from Ancient Greek διάβολος (diábolos, "devil, accuser, slanderer").
