The general acceptance, not necessarily within <u>Sufi</u> <u>discourse</u>, is that the Qur'an descended firstly (i.e., first Tanazzul) to the <u>Luh Al-</u> *Mahfuz* (Preserved Scripturum) in an early unknown or undefined time.

Later on, the Qur'an descended to the cosmic realm in the <u>Laylat al-Qadr</u> (Night of Destiny). This is based on an understanding of <u>sura Al-Qadr</u>:1 as referring to descent of the Qur'an in its entirety. This is backed by <u>`Abd Allah ibn `Abbas</u> "... descended in <u>Ramadan</u>, on the Laylat al-Qadr in one lay down (jumlah, Arجملة), ..."

In this line of development, the final descent was when the Qur'an was revealed to the <u>Islamic prophet</u> <u>Muhammad</u> by the angel Gabriel.
