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### Etymology 1

#### Verb

جَنَّ (janna) I. non-past يَجُنُّ (yajunnu)

1. to cover, to hide, to conceal, to veil
2. to envelop, to enshrroud, to cloak, to screen
3. to descend, to fall, to become night

#### Conjugation

1. to be possessed, to be insane, to be crazy, to be mad
