pentad (*plural pentads*)

1. A group or series of five things.
2. A mean average value of temperature, etc., taken every five days.
3. (*chemistry*) Any element, atom, or radical having a valence of five, or which can be combined with, substituted for or compared with, five atoms of hydrogen or other monad.

*Nitrogen is a **pentad** in the ammonium compounds.*
