The name Susan derives from the French “Susanne,” which stemmed from the Late Latin “Susanna” meaning “lily” or “rose.” The name originated from the Hebrew “shoshannah.” Gaelic forms of Susan are “Susanna,” “Sosanna,” “Susan” and “Siiisan” – the latter two being Scottish. The Anglo-Normans brought the name to Ireland.

In the Old Testament of the Bible, Susanna was falsely accused of adultery, and whose accusers were eventually condemned. In the New Testament of the Bible, Susanna ministered to Jesus Christ.

POPULARITY

According to the 1990 United States Census, Susan ranked as the 8th most popular female first name and the 67,386th most popular last name. In the United States, the name ranked in the Top 1,000 most popular girls' names every decade since 1880 and in the Top 1,000 most popular boys' names in the 1940s, 1950s and 1960s. In the 21st century, the name ranked in the Top 700 most popular girls' names every year from 2000 (429th) through 2006 (611th), but the name’s popularity appears to be on the decline.

Susan is a feminine given name, a form of Susanna, deriving originally from Middle Egyptian "sšn" (lotus flower), first reported on an 11th Dynasty sarcophagus dating from approximately 2000 B.C. However, the Hebrew root for the name for the lily, שושן, is derived from the root שוש or ששנ, meaning "to be joyful, bright, or cheerful", which is the basis for the word and name ששון Sasson, meaning "joy of life*". The Persian name for lily is سوسن *sousan*, *susan*. The name of Susa, an ancient city of Persia, may be derived from the lilies which abounded in the plain in which it was situated.
